Britten's *Ballad of Heroes* suggests that failing to take a stand is equivalent to acquiescence. And Beethoven praises music as the tonic to tame our propensity for aggression in a work that foreshadows his famous Symphony No. 9. Germinal Stage presents *Absurduo*, two mid-20th century existential classics consisting of: THE CHAIRS by Eugene Ionesco and KRAPP'S LAST TAPE by Samuel Beckett.

Originally written in 1952 and subtitled by the author as "a tragic farce", *The Chairs* was acclaimed when produced on Broadway during the 1998 season in the Theatre de Complicite/Royal Court production. An absurdist play of the first order by a master innovator of the genre. The premise: an elderly couple spend their time collecting and inventorying chairs only to be overcome by the very objects that give their lives meaning.

Krapp's Last Tape, is Samuel Beckett's moving meditation on time, memory and aging. An old man sits alone at a table, preparing for his annual ritual: to archive the last year of his weary life on tape as he's done on his birthday ever since he was a young man. Listening in on an earlier recording, he's drawn into a chilling dialogue with his younger, brashly confident self-but are the memories he evokes better left unheard?

Beckett's haunting one-man play is a brief but highly intense experience, giving voice to the conversations we have with ourselves across time - an essay in loneliness, but shot through with grim humor.

Chronicling the life of Heather Booth, a lifelong progressive organizer, the film follows her journey from civil rights activist in the 60s to her founding of the Midwest Academy, a training institute for progressive community organizers.

From a politically conscious college student who began her career in 1964 registering voters in Mississippi at the height of the Civil Rights movement, Heather became the go-to strategist for causes ranging from child care to women's rights to immigration reform and advisor to leaders including Julian Bond and Senator Elizabeth Warren.

The film blends archival and contemporary footage with interviews with close friends, clients, political colleagues, students and others to understand this one person's legacy in progressive politics. This is a timely film that arms viewers with methods they can employ to preserve our democratic principles.

The goal is for Heather Booth: Changing the World to serve as a tool for community organizing, through education and awareness, and as a guide for mobilizing that inspires activism and ignites change.

Director Lilly Rivlin is an award winning American-Israeli journalist, writer, and independent filmmaker based in New York. She has produced and directed many documentaries about women who are political activists. She has been an activist for peace between Israelis and Palestinians for many decades and is a former president of Meretz USA, now Partners for a Progressive Israel. Lilly was the 2013-14 recipient of the Miller Distinguished Jewish Woman Filmmaker Award.



The Jefferson Symphony Orchestra will kick off its 65th anniversary concert season with a powerhouse program featuring Beethoven's Symphony No. 5, Brahm's *Tragic Overture* and Elgar's *Enigma Variations*.

Even those who are not classical music aficionados recognize Beethoven's Fifth Symphony's four note opening motif of short, short, long. The Fifth Symphony offers something for everyone from the drama of the first movement to the uplifting final movement.

Johannes Brahms titled *Tragic Overture* accordingly to emphasize the tormented character of the piece. It offers a dark contrast to his more lighthearted *Academic Festival Overture* which was composed the same year in 1880.

Also on the program is Edward Elgar's well-known Enigma Variations. As Elgar explains it, "This works, commenced in a spirit of humor and continued in deep seriousness, contains sketches of the composer's friends. It may be understood that these personages comment or reflect on the original theme and each one attempts a solution of the Enigma, for so the theme is called. The sketches are not 'portraits' but each variation contains a distinct idea founded on some particular personality or perhaps on some incident known only to two people."
